This year the theme for Book Week Scotland is "Blether" and we have a fantastic line up of authors that includes LJ Flanders a personal trainer; Colin MacLachlan, Former SAS operator and star of Channel 4's SAS: Who Dares Wins and Channel 5's Secrets of the SAS, and Paul Murton of the BBC's Grand Tour of Scotland will be sharing his knowledge on the history, local traditions and folk lore of Orkney, Shetland and other places in Scotland. 
